	Meeting Convened at 6:03p.m. in the Moitoza – Pettey Hearing Room	
Public Hearing	Pursuant to Article 21, "Zoning," Section 7C, "Special Permits," of the General Bylaws of the Town of Berkley, the Board of Selectmen will hold a public hearing on September 29, 2021 at 6 p.m. in the Hearing Room at the Town Office Building, One North Main Street, Berkley, Massachusetts, regarding the application of Bruno Lopes for a special permit to operate a home office for LB & Sons Construction Co to register his business for business mail and HIC License at property known as and numbered 88 Jerome St, Berkley, Massachusetts, further identified in the Assessor's records at Map 9, Lot 29-04. Interested parties are welcome to attend and comment. A copy of the aforesaid application is on file with the Town Clerk and is available for public inspection during the Town Offices' regular business hours.  Bruno Lopes, 88 Jerome Street, spoke on why he is looking to get this special permit. Miller asked Lopes, to be clear, all you're asking for is to have his business license renewed under this address and receive mail at the location, not to have any equipment or customers at the home. Lopes said yes that's all he's looking to do and all the work is being done at the customer's home. Nobody from the public spoke. New Business	Taken out of order. The board reviewed the agenda request form from David Barwick regarding his complaint with the Zoning Officer and Babbitt Way.  David Barwick, 6 Babbitt Way, read a statement of his perspective of the history of the special permit denial for 11 Babbitt Way. Miller explained that the Board of Selectmen are not an enforcement board and feels these complaints may be out of the boards hands. Barwick said he submitted a letter on September 8th to the Zoning Enforcement Officer. Upon giving this letter, Joseph Biszko told Barwick he would be on vacation for three weeks. Barwick said received a letter from the backup Zoning Officer. The board cleared up that this was a clerical error and that he is not the backup Zoning Officer, he is only the backup Building Inspector. Barwick gave information and pictures to the board of what he thinks is illegally happening on the farm that is not considered agricultural. Karen McSweeney, 6 Saints Way, asked how many vehicles are allowed on the property. Miller replied by saying due to no special permit being issued, there is no limit. Harry Eliopoulos, the Rodrigues's attorney, who was just recently retained, stated they will do what they need to do to be within the bylaws. Discussion continued on the fine line with what is and isn't agricultural.  Ms. McSweeney is concerned that the Rodrigues' are using other properties and building a road to exit onto Saint's Way. Attorney Eliopoulos stated that they have nothing to do with the road the neighbor is building.  Mr. Frank Vaz, 9 Babbitt Way, questioned if volleyball and soccer are considered agricultural. Mr. Miller stated he is going to talk with the Building Inspector to review these items. Mr. Miller also stated that they need to differentiate between their own private parties and agricultural activities. He noted that since there is no special permit, the determinations are made by the Building Inspector. Mr. Vaz stated that the noise is unbelievable and states the neighbors are being harassed.
