For the free sign, we will request to make a photocopy of your driver's license/ID to confirm age and residency.

### Nan's Stuffed Quahogs

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 8 quahogs
- 1/2 lb minced clams
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup white wine (dry)
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup onion, diced
- ½ sweet bell pepper, diced
- 1 Cajun andouille sausage
- 3 tbsp dried parsley
- 4 tbsp unsalted butter
- 1 package Stove Top Stuffing (savory herb)

#### DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Scrub quahogs. Place in large pot with sausage, water and wine. Bring to a boil and simmer until clams open. Remove from broth. Reserve broth.
- Reserve broth.
  2. Chop clams. Remove casing from sausage and crumble. Sauté onion, sweet pepper and garlic for 3-4 minutes in a little butter.
- Prepare package stuffing as directed using clam broth for liquid.
- Mix all ingredients together quahogs, clams, veggies, stuffing.
- Split shells in half. Clean out any sandy residue. Divide mixture among split shells equally (16 halves).
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees in oven for 20 minutes.

Just about all Berkley residents have traveled down Berkley Street and crossed the Taunton River using the Weir Bridge. Over the centuries, the Weir Bridge has had many forms. This picture shows the old drawbridge at the Weir circa 1890. It was a popular gathering spot for local residents. On both sides of the bridge there was this sign:

'By a city ordinance-any person riding or driving any horse over this bridge faster than a walk is liable to a penalty of \$1 for each

# Fuel Assistance

Fuel assistance begins November 1<sup>st</sup>. This program provides assistance to low-income eligible individuals and families to help pay for heating costs. If you received fuel assistance last year, Citizens for Citizens, Inc. will be mailing out this year's renewal application around the end of August and during September. For new enrollees, applications will be made available at the Berkley Council on Aging sometime in October. If you wish to apply for the first time, or require help with the renewal process, please call Lucille, our Outreach Worker, at (508) 821-3105 for more information or for a list of required documentation.

### Medicare Open Enrollment

Every year, Medicare Part D, Medigaps and Medicare Advantage (HMO, PPO) plans can change their premiums, co-pays, deductibles, formularies (list of drugs covered) and preferred pharmacies. It's important to review your options EVERY year to make sure you have the plan that works best for you for 2022.

We want to remind you that our SHINE Counselor, Lucille, is here to assist with your Medicare and Medicaid needs, especially during the **Annual Open Enrollment** from **October 15<sup>th</sup> through December 7<sup>th</sup>**. This is the time of the year to review and change your Medicare coverage for 2022. We will start taking appointments for Open Enrollment in October.
