## Easiest-Ever Pumpkin Pie

#### INGREDIENTS:

- ¾ cup sugar
- 1 ½ teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)
- 1 ¼ cups evaporated milk or half and half
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 crust from 1 package (12 oz) frozen Pillsbury Deep Dish Pie Crusts (2 count)

#### DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat oven to 425 degrees. In large bowl, mix filling ingredients. Pour into pie crust.
- 2. Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees. Bake 40 to 50 minutes longer or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Cool 2 hours.
- 3. Serve or refrigerate until serving time. Store in refrigerator.

### Roasted Sweet Potatoes

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 2 lbs sweet potatoes
- 2 tablespoons avocado oil or olive oil
- ½ teaspoon cumin
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- Salt and pepper to taste

#### DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.
- Peel potatoes (if you'd like) and cut into ½ inch cubes. 2. Add avocado or olive oil and spices to the sweet
- potatoes. Use your hands to toss everything together until it's well mixed.
- 3. Arrange sweet potatoes in a single layer on a large baking sheet, making sure there's space between the cubes.
- 4. Roast for 30-35 minutes. Stir the potatoes halfway through to ensure all sides are cooked through.

# Berkley Historical Society

Moments from the Museum:

Recently, we had a visitor at the Berkley Historical Society Museum and we are always happy to see her. She always has something to share about living in Berkley and we love to hear her stories. This day, she shared a charming story that I think you might find interesting and heartwarming too.

She was born in 1932 and proudly told us with her next birthday she will be 90 years of age. As the conversation developed, the subject moved into how Berkley came to be known as the "cow town" due to the large number of dairy farms. Our visitor mentioned that one of them, Colpitt Dairy, had a contract with



the School Department to be the supplier of milk for the school children. Each day, milk was delivered in cute little ½ pint glass bottles and money was collected from the students by the teacher. At the end of the week, a student was selected to walk to the Colpitt Dairy farm office with the money in an envelope to be delivered to Mr. Colpitt. You can imagine how being selected was a great honor because the child needed to have exemplary conduct, attendance and grades, and the teacher trusted the student. Our visitor told us of the time she was selected and how wonderful and important it made her feel to have this task to care for. The walk was not far.. merely 3 houses down the street from the school to 7 North Main Street. But oh, how proud she was to have the responsibility.

These are the stories that add color to the tapestry of life in Berkley. We at the Museum love hearing them. Do you have a story to share? Come visit us! The BHS Museum is open on Tuesdays from 10am-1pm. Admission is FREE! We look forward to seeing you. Submitted by Eden Jones

# Fuel Assistance

Fuel assistance begins November 1<sup>st</sup>. This program provides assistance to low-income eligible individuals and families to help pay for heating costs. If you received fuel assistance last year, Citizens for Citizens, Inc. will be mailing out this year's renewal application around the end of August and during September. For new enrollees, applications will be made available at the Berkley Council on Aging sometime in October. If you wish to apply for the first time, or require help with the renewal process, please call Lucille, our Outreach Worker, at (508) 821-3105 for more information or for a list of required documentation.



# Medicare Open Enrollment

Every year, Medicare Part D, Medigaps and Medicare Advantage (HMO, PPO) plans can change their premiums, co-pays, deductibles, formularies (list of drugs covered) and preferred pharmacies. It's important to review your options EVERY year to make sure you have the plan that works best for you for 2022.

We want to remind you that our SHINE Counselor, Lucille, is here to assist with your Medicare and Medicaid needs, especially during the **Annual Open Enrollment** from **October 15<sup>th</sup> through December 7<sup>th</sup>**. This is the time of the year to review and change your Medicare coverage for 2022. We will start taking appointments for Open Enrollment in October.

Are you turning 65? Are you thinking about retiring? Are you struggling to financially cover your medical expenses? For assistance with Medicare issues, schedule your appointment with Lucille by calling the COA at (508) 821-3105.
