If you are glancing over this newsletter and something made you continue reading this article, then allow me to share insight into yoga, my connection, and the rewards possible.

As an emergency room nurse and mother, yoga became my outlet. Fate brought me to teach in Berkley – the town I grew up in, bought a home, and raised my family in.

Holistic in nature, I believe learning to listen to your body, accepting its imperfect perfections (but only through trying) and learning to let go is the mission of class. Each class includes instruction into and out of postures with options that offer different levels of practice. You'd be amazed at some of the ways we get into some seemingly impossible positions! We strengthen each week as a group, learning from each other and supporting each other on and off the mat, making class fun. We twist, bend, and tumble out of poses, and we do the hardest pose possible; we find stillness and learn to follow our breath.

Education on health and wellness during yoga class will help you learn to listen to your body, change it for the better, and make you want to return to your mat each week. Class is open to all on Fridays at 9am in the COA Activity Room. Mats and supplies provided.

# BERKLEY FIRE/RESCUE Blue Address Sign Campaign

These signs help members of the Fire Department locate your house in an emergency (it also helps delivery drivers!) Seconds count in an emergency and these help greatly. We are offering **FREE** signs for seniors ages 65+ (limited to the first 200 only) who do not have an address sign. All other signs are \$20. Fill out a request form (the COA has forms too) and drop it off at the Berkley Fire/Rescue, 5 North Main Street – next door to COA/Town Hall. For the free sign, we will request to make a photocopy of your driver's license/ID to confirm age and residency. We can also assist with

mounting the signs if needed. Please call the Fire Department at (508) 822-7516 to request assistance or ask when you request a sign.

# Medicare Open Enrollment

Every year, Medicare Part D, Medigaps and Medicare Advantage (HMO, PPO) plans can change their premiums, co-pays, deductibles, formularies (list of drugs covered) and preferred pharmacies. It's important to review your options EVERY year to make sure you have the plan that works best for you for 2022.

We want to remind you that our SHINE Counselor, Lucille, is here to assist with your Medicare and Medicaid needs, especially during the **Annual Open Enrollment** from **October 15th through December 7th**. This is the time of the year to review and change your Medicare coverage for 2022. We will start taking appointments for Open Enrollment in October.


