

Moments From The Museum

In this newsletter we will be visiting two more of Berkley's 19th century Public Schools.

SCHOOLHOUSE #3

This school was also known as the **Bridge Village School.** It was located at the corner of Elm Street and Berkley St. This school was well attended by students due to the concentration of families that lived in the Bridge Village area. Due to the concentrated river traffic, The Bridge Village was practically a town by itself with all the necessary resources. In addition to the school, there was a chapel, blacksmith, dry goods store, cartwright, tailor and many other services.

The Bridge Village school was built in 1872. Picture #1 shows the location on Elm St. To the left of the school is what was then known as New Road. Today we know that road as Berkley St. This schoolhouse was in use for 45

years when a fire destroyed it in November 1917. Fortunately, due to the fast work of neighbors to the school, many items were saved: the blackboard, the organ, a table, teacher's desk and many of the pupil's



desks. Also, the shutters, doors and steps were saved. Across the street close to where Wallace Drive is now, there was a chapel and it was used as the school during the week for the remainder of the season.



In the 2nd picture we see the same school from the east side looking west across the Taunton River. The school was built on a hill that allowed

a nice vista of the river. In this picture you can just make out the river in the background in front of the school.

SCHOOLHOUSE #4


This school was also known as the **Assonet Neck School**. It was located on Assonet
Neck Road which today we know as Bay
View Avenue. It was in close proximity to
Dean Lane. During the warm seasons many
students went to school barefoot. There was
no bus transportation so they all walked or
maybe rode a horse to school if it wasn't
needed that day on the farm. Due to the
concentration of farms in this area, often
time during spring season the student
attendance at the school would be very few
because the children were expected to help
with the planting of crops.

Picture #3 shows what this schoolhouse looked like and is a delight to view as it gives us a good idea of what the children wore back in the




days of the 19th century. Most likely the teacher told them that a photographer would be coming and no doubt their clothing is probably Sunday best!

Come visit the Berkley Historical Society Museum any Tuesday between 10 am and 1 pm. It is located at 2 No. Main Street, Berkley, MA just across the street from the Safety Building. Admission is free! When you step into the Museum you step back in Berkley history. We look forward to meeting you!
