




Bristol Elder Services Seminar



MOMENTS FROM THE MUSEUM


The BHS Museum has a modest library of books, documents and photos. Among the collection is a binder with stories of Berkley and her residents. The compilation of stories is called Legends and Places About Berkley. One of the most asked about 'legends' is Rock House Hill. This hill is located where So Main Street bears left and Elm Street starts. Here is a copy of that story as related by long ago Berkley resident, Inez B. French:


"There is a mystery about this historic hill. The mystery concerns both what it is and what it isn't. There is no house on Rock House Hill and there never was. Then why the name? If you investigate for yourself, just ask any schoolboy who happens along the road between the Common and the Bridge. He will tell you and perhaps lead you to the very place. In the beginning there was the extraordinary rock. A Far-reaching mass of granite which forms the hill and crops out of the ground near the corner just where the former old stage road turns south toward Assonet Village. A hill, no doubt, since the Creation!

Here a Berkleyite once built his house. In the early days a man named Axtell, knowing of 'the house built on sand' (Matthew 7:26,27) chose this extraordinary rock and wisely upon which to build his house. And though he chose the rock he did not build a rock house; otherwise, it would probably yet stand at the corner. It is nowadays as it was in the beginning. There is still the rock with only the encroaching forest with blackberry vines and the trailing ivy. The enduring rock! Simple reason for the name and mystery--Rock House Hill! "

A further story about Rock House Hill is that there is a naturally occurring cavity in the hill and it made a perfect cellar over which to build a house. The photo below is from the 1895 map of Berkley.

If you like reading the Monday Moments from the Museum, then you will LOVE visiting the Museum! There is no admission (but donations are welcome!) Stop by soon!




