

MOMENTS FROM THE MUSEUM

The History of the Berkley Library: Part 2

Prior to the current building, on September 23, 1893, in a small room to the right of the entrance of the Old Town Hall on the Common, the Berkley Public Library was opened. It contained 220 volumes, 169 of which were presented by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and 51 of which were from Berkley citizens. Miss Julia Burt was the first librarian at an annual salary of \$15.00. The library was open only on Saturday afternoons. By 1900 the library collection had grown to 806 books and Miss Burt's salary had risen to \$25.00 a year.

Through the years, improvements including the installation of electricity, a heating system, and indoor plumbing were made. The charm of the fireplace and the large windows that surround the building and provide natural light remain. The building is otherwise true to its original design.

In 1986 the library joined the Automated Bristol Library Exchange (ABLE) a network of libraries agreeing to share materials. In 1995, ABLE merged with the SEAL network adding libraries along the south coast of Bristol and Plymouth counties. The new organization became known as SAILS. The present membership includes more than 70 public, academic and school libraries in over 40 communities. Member libraries have access to more than 3.7 million books and other materials.
