There is no proof of income required!



MOMENTS FROM THE MUSEUM

This story is not specifically about Berkley but it does include Taunton which Berkley was once part of prior to 1735. It is an interesting, almost bizarre story of a little scruffy terrier mix dog with the name Owney. His story starts in 1888. His master worked for the postal system in Albany, NY and Owney would walk with him to work each day to the train station where his master worked for the Railway Mail Service. The train cars would be loaded with bags of mail to be sent to post offices across the nation. Soon the little dog began following the wagons loaded with bags of mail to the train and then eventually followed the mail bags into the mail cars and slept on the bags. Off he would go to wherever that train was headed crisscrossing the nation visiting post offices at each stop. Owney would be treated like royalty enjoying hospitality fit for a king by the postal clerks along the way. Why his owner didn't put a stop to Owney's vagabond ways remains unknown.

As time went on, a mail clerk at each stop, including Taunton, Mass. would attach to his collar a metal tag identifying where Owney had been. National news started reporting the dog's travels and notice was made that despite the proclivity of train wrecks, none of the trains Owney chose to travel on was ever in an accident. So now he became the nation's postal good luck charm. Eventually he had so many metal tags attached to his collar that the weight of them drained his energy. Sometime after 1889, Postmaster General John Wannamaker had a jacket made for the dog so his whole body would bear the weight of the tags instead of just his neck. Owney received the heart-shaped identification token from Edmund F. Flynn, a postal clerk in Taunton, Massachusetts.

Sadly, as Owney aged his personality changed from being affable to cranky. Probably due to arthritis. In 1897 in Toledo, OH he bit a mail clerk who was trying to look at some of the tags attached to Owney's jacket. When the US Marshall came to investigate, Owney attacked him also and the dog was shot dead. His body was stuffed and he is now in the Smithsonian Institute along with his jacket and tags. A sad ending for little Owney.

The Berkley Historical Society Museum is OPEN on Tuesdays between 10 am & 1 pm. Admission is free! The Museum is located at 2 North Main Street Berkley, MA in the white building opposite the Safety Building. We look forward to meeting you!


