Moments From the Museum

The Old Town Hall has been standing on the Berkley Common since 1849 serving the needs of the Town's population through the variety of boards and committees for 140 years. These 3 photos show how little the Old Town Hall has changed structurally. Yet it has served as a meeting place for many years after it was decommissioned as the Town Hall in 1989 when the Old Grammar/Junior High School became the Berkley Town Hall. Today at 173 years old, the Old Town Hall is the Berkley Historical Society Museum. The interior has been restored to the original dimensions. The original flooring has been uncovered and treated to a fresh coat of varnish. There are even some of the old benches that were used since1849 in the Reading and Research area. When you step inside you step back in Berkley history.

Fill out a request form (the COA has forms too) and drop it off at the Berkley Fire/Rescue, 5 North Main Street – next door to COA/Town Hall. For the free sign, we will request to make a photocopy of your driver's license/ID to confirm age and residency. We can also assist with mounting the signs if needed. Please call the Fire
